### **HIDDEN EASTER EGGS TO FIND DURING THE WALK**

There are 2 walks, one for Upper Froyle and one for Lower Froyle. Feel free to do 1 or both over the weekend. **These walks are NOT suitable for pushchairs - please ensure you wear suitable footwear/boots.**

**All answers can be obtained from the roadside or public paths - please do NOT venture onto private land at any time (other than the specific case noted).**

Directions for both walks are within the body of the questions and you can begin anywhere. But if in doubt, we suggest you start the Upper Froyle Quiz at Froyle Park at the entrance off Hen & Chicken Hill and the Lower Froyle one by the Village Hall.

### **FOR THE LITTLE ONES**

Not only are there quite a few Easter eggs hidden on both routes for you to find – do leave some for the next lot! - we thought it might be fun for the younger generation to **draw/paint a picture when they get home of an animal/bird (any wildlife) they might have seen on the quiz route(s).**

### **ANSWERS**

**Drop your answers and your drawing/painting into the temporary post box fixed to the side of the Old Football Hut (NOT the normal post box) at the Recreation Ground; or scan your answers and send them to [kwilson2525@btinternet.com](mailto:kwilson2525@btinternet.com). 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## **UPPER FROYLE RAMBLING QUIZ QUESTIONS**

**YOU WILL NEED TO TAKE A PAD AND PEN FOR YOUR ANSWERS**

***Starting from the entrance to Froyle Park off Hen & Chicken Hill***

1. How many poplar trees line the road (off Hen & Chicken Hill – Fiennes Lane) into Froyle Park?

2. In Froyle Park there is a pond next to Fiennes Lane. What creature was the pond and surrounding habitat specially created for?

***Carry on through Burnham Square and then to Froyle Green.***

3. What time did the clock in Burnham Square stop at?
4. There is a date clearly visible above one of the terraced houses in Burnham Square, Froyle Park – what is it?
5. What is the name of the loyal Treloar School employee named on the plaque at the entrance into Froyle Green?

***Leave Froyle Green and turn right onto the main road for 100 metres.***

6. How many trees line the entrance path to the front door of Froyle Park?

***At St. Mary's Church Froyle.***

7. There are windows either side of the main door to the church. What letters are in the centre of the windows?
8. What medals were awarded to 'James Gillies Benson' whose ashes are buried in the churchyard? (These can easily be viewed from the pathways – please do not walk over graves to answer this question.)

***Return to the main road to the T-Junction by the Church***

9. What is the distance to Yarnhams from the signpost on the road outside the Church/Froyle Park?
10. On the bus stop outside Froyle Park what is the contact text number?

***Take the road by the signpost - up the hill towards Yarnhams to the Cemetery***

11. How many steps lead into the Graveyard? **COUNT ALL STEPS**

***Return to the road. Turn right back towards Froyle, in approx. 50 metres turn left at the first gate you come to on the left. Heading north take the public footpath and walk over the fields, passing the fallen tree, to the top (about 500 metres). At the top of the field (before the kissing-gate) turn right along the set-aside for 250 metres – this will take you to the War Memorial. Please note the final stretch to the War Memorial is private land, however, we have permission to cross here purely for the purpose of the quiz, 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> April.***

12. How many poppies are on the handrail leading up to the War Memorial?
13. What does the bench at the War Memorial Commemorate?
14. How many names of those who died begin with the letter 'H' and the letter 'S' – please give one total number.

***Down onto the road turn right and continue back towards Upper Froyle. Please take extreme care on the road as it is very narrow in places.***

15. At Coombe Field Cottage what animal is mentioned on the wooden notice at the end of the drive?
16. What form of transport is above the house **name sign** for "Manderley"?

**Turn left on to Gid Lane**

17. What is the colour of the horse in the field beside Gid Lane?

**Return to the main road, turn left, the Quiz ends at the Church**

18. As we know, there are a number of Saints displayed on some of the houses in Upper Froyle. One Saint is accompanied by an animal – what type of animal is it?

19. One cottage in Upper Froyle used to be the Upper Froyle village shop – do you know what it is now called?

20. How many mushrooms are there under the grain store near the Church?

**AND THE FINAL TIE-BREAKER QUESTION:**

How many houses in Froyle (Upper and Lower) have the word ‘cottage’ within their name? A best guess answer will suffice.

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## **LOWER FROYLE RAMBLING QUIZ QUESTIONS**

**YOU WILL NEED TO TAKE A PAD AND PEN FOR YOUR ANSWERS**

***Starting from the Village Hall and recreation ground***

1. How many Solar Panels are there on the roof of the Village Hall?
2. What is the colour of the inner casing for the defibrillator outside the village hall?

***Recreation ground***

3. How many upright bamboo poles from the ground hold the Willow Dome together?

***In the southerly corner of the recreation ground take the public footpath between the sheep field and Westburn Fields. At the end of the public footpath turn left into Park Lane.***

4. On Park Lane, which way up would this cottage serve your morning egg?
5. Give the title of the song from the 80's ‘L ..... Wine’? The name of a cottage in Park Lane will answer this question for you!

***Turn right at end of Park Lane and left into Husseys Lane***

6. There is a Double Flow Grain Drier in Lower Froyle. What is the name of the company who made it?
7. What does the big yellow 'H' in the road point to?

***Turn right then after 75 metres turn left into Husseys Lane***

8. There are 2 ponds visible from the road in Lower Froyle (not on private land). One is at the bottom of Husseys lane – where is the other one? (you have to know the answer to this question as you won't have passed it!)
9. How many 'low tree stump bollards' are there beside the pond in Husseys Lane?
10. What date appears on the wall of one of the houses at the beginning of the lane?
11. What 3 letters appear on the FIRST telegraph pole?
12. How many bird feeders are hanging in the tree outside Old Brewery House?
13. There are 2 numbers on the yellow H sign – what are they?
14. How many lantern lights are either on, or hanging from, houses in this lane? Look carefully, there may be more than you think!!!
15. What colour is the Shepherds Hut?

***Walk on up Husseys Lane, past the last house for a further 300 metres to the first public footpath on your left, cross the fields to the west, over the stiles, past the Quarry and Kiln House on your right, across Well Lane, over another stile and follow the public path over fields.***

16. Some way on from Well Lane you will see a number of pots alongside and on a wall. How many are there?

***At the end of the fields you will get to a metal gate and a tarmac drive. Turn left onto the drive and walk to the bottom. Turn left onto the main road into Lower Froyle. Please take extreme care on the road as it is quite narrow in places. The final questions can be answered on this stretch. The quiz ends at the T-junction beside the village notice board.***

17. Somewhere you can see a fox, a hare and separately a dog – what are they made from?
18. What is the name of the house that was once the 'Prince of Wales Pub'? The original sign is faint but can be seen.
19. How far is it to Crondall from the bottom of Well Lane?
20. How many post boxes are there in Lower Froyle **AS OF TODAY'S DATE?**

How many houses in Froyle (Upper and Lower) have the word 'cottage' within their name? A best guess answer will suffice.
